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say Amadis - I will appreciate it. But please don't send me more than one book.

Also, there is a catch — they have a new rule here now that inmates are allowed to receive books only if they are sent directly from the publisher, a book club, or a bookstore. So you would not be able to send me a book yourself. You would have to order it and have it shipped to me directly from the publisher or a bookstore.
